## Dear Community,

Other than having a power outage for two days during the first week of school, we have had a very good start to the 2022/23 school year. Not only has the weather been great this fall, but our students continue to excel in the classroom, as well as in their extra-curricular activities. Our test scores are among the highest in the county, but we will never be content with our success, and we will always continuously strive for improvement with our student offerings each school year.

In order to continually improve, the district went through a 5-year strategic planning process in the spring of 2022. Student and staff safety, along with bringing back joy to learning are high on our priority list. In order to accomplish all of our goals, our facilities need improvements too. The district will have three proposals on the November 8th ballot. All three proposals will NOT increase tax rates. The three proposals are for a 10-year renewal of our 18 mills assessed against non-homestead property (all school districts in Michigan have this millage in order to receive full per pupil finding), our 3rd 10-year 0.85 sinking fund millage (funds can be used for construction, repair, technology, and safety items), and a new \$26.5 million bond issue for several projects across the district. The proposed ballot language, a detailed list of our \$26.5 million bond issue, and an informational video is available on our website at www.armadaschools.org. Please remember to vote on November 8th.
