Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent Musary shared the following Armada School Updates:

- Per the January 13, 2021 MDHHS Order (effective through January 31, 2021)
 - Preschool through 12th grade open for in-person instruction (local district choice)
 - Childcare facilities are open
 - Can do non-contact sports such as bowling and swimming
 - Contact sports (i.e., basketball, competitive cheer, and wrestling) can do indoor conditioning, weight lifting, and non-contact drills as long as social distancing and wearing a mask. Competitions are not allowed at this time.
 - Out-of-season sports are allowed to do indoor conditioning as long as social distancing and wearing a mask.

<u>Curriculum Update</u>: Assistant Superintendent of Instruction and Curriculum, Mr. Phil Jankowski, provided an update of the following:

> Learning Plan Update: All schools must offer in person learning by March 1, 2021.

- Participation Rates: Attendance Rates since the return to school January 4, 2021 were between 80.1% and 96.45%.
- > Additional Empower Q & A Sessions are scheduled for February 8, 2021.
- Professional Development: Took place on January 18th along with a Staff Appreciation lunch. Additional dates are February 8, 2021 and March 8, 2021.
- > WIDA Testing is scheduled February 1 through April 9, 2021
- NWEA testing should be completed by January 29, 2021
- Trimester 3 Learning option survey will open on February 12 and close on the 19th.
