ARMADA SCHOOL UPDATES

- At Krause Elementary, they received a grant from L & L Products that provided 50 new tablets for our kindergarten through 2nd grade students. In addition, the district purchased 110 tablets from our CARES Act technology funds. Students use these devices to record themselves reading on See Saw, complete independent math work on iXL, and listen or read stories on RAZ kids.
- At the middle school, athletics and robotics are back and the students are enjoying a bit of normalcy.
- At the high school, students just completed a Project Care competition by donating items for the local food pantry at St. Mary's in Armada. Also, George Calvert (skilled trades) and Isabella Perry (HOSA) were named our CTE Students of the Year the MISD produced a virtual ceremony to honor all of the students in Macomb County.
- At MA2S, the Fighting Pi robotics team is preparing for their virtual competition called Infinite Recharge, a Star Wars concept using droids to fight off asteroid showers by gathering power cells to charge their space vehicle shields (all in 135 seconds).
