Superintendent's Report:

- At Krause Elementary, the Open House was well attended. Parents and teachers have been pleased that we are able to keep class sizes low with the addition of the new staff members.
- At the M.S., N.W.E.A testing began this week. Also, fall sports are off and running. In addition, the NJS application window has opened up for students.
- At the H.S., two students received a Letter of Commendation from the National Merit Scholarship program. Also, the NHS induction ceremony will take place on September 29th. In addition, fall sports are underway highlighted by the boys tennis team and varsity football teams which are both undefeated in the BWAC. The homecoming parade will be Friday, October 1st at 4:30 pm followed by a varsity football game at 7:00 pm vs. Imlay City. The homecoming dance will be Saturday, October 2nd at the Fair Grounds.
- Through the first three weeks of school, the district has had 13 students (6 elementary, 2 middle school, and 5 high school) and one middle school staff member test positive for COVID-19.
