Krause Elementary Presentation:

Krause Elementary School Principal, Pam Lillie, and Assistant Principal, Robert Girvin, provided a presentation which highlighted some of the following:

- 2020-2021 M-Step Testing was highly successful. Krause Elementary recorded the highest scores in Macomb County in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade math and ELA.
- There has been an increase in student enrollment by about 61 elementary students this year.
- There were 23 additional staff members hired at Krause Elementary for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Krause Elementary was the only elementary school to remain face to face last school year.
- There were 15 Armada Education Foundation Grant Winners this year. Some of the funded items were: new library furniture, light table, SMART board, Fidgets and more.
- Krause Elementary continues to focus on; support for new staff members, grade level meetings, Title I programs, testing, meetings, data review, and after school tutoring.
- The staff and students are looking forward to returning to the lunch room, having Family Fun Night again, return of parent volunteers, and field trips.

Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent Musary shared the following Armada School Updates:

2021/22 General Fund budget Amendment Highlights

- Total expenditures are \$1.2 million higher than the June 15, 2021 budget due to additional staffing, improved hourly employee wages & benefits, and additional grant funding. The district hired 17 new teachers for the 2021/22 school year (40% of teaching staff hired within last 3 school years).
- Revenues are up \$1 million vs. the June 15, 2021 budget due to student growth, higher per pupil funding, and additional grant funds.
- Fund Equity is up \$493,000 vs. the June 15, 2021 budget due to \$684,000 carryover funds (unspent budgets).
- Potential favorable future budget concepts:
 - District historically does not spend entire budget this means the district fund equity will likely remain stable as of June 30, 2022
 - ESSER funding still "held up", but Armada stands to gain over \$1 million if approved.
 - State revenues are better than projected which means a funding increase for schools.

Governor Whitmer has proposed a \$435 per pupil funding increase for 22/23.

Armada School Updates

- At Krause Elementary, K-5 students participated in the 2022 National Career Development Association Art & Poetry contest. We had three K-2 students and three grade 3-5 students place in the top three spots in the state competition and their artwork will be considered at the national level in June 2022.
- At the M.S., five students participated in the Macomb Student Diversity Summit Zoom meeting today. One of our M.S. students won 14 Regional Scholastic Art Awards.
- At the H.S., ten students participated in the Macomb Student Diversity Summit Zoom meeting today. Four H.S. students won Regional Scholastic Art Awards.
- At MA2S, the Fighting Pi robotics team is preparing for in-person competitions this year after being virtual last season. The competition this year is called RAPID REACT where teams must use innovative engineering, creative thinking, and teamwork to reimagine the future of safe, high-speed travel, and lightning-fast deliveries to propel the next evolution of transportation forward. The robot must be autonomous for the first 15 seconds of each competition, then for the remaining 2 minutes & 15 seconds drivers will control the robot.

<u>Curriculum Update:</u> Assistant Superintendent of Instruction and Curriculum, Kelly Skokna, provided an update of the following:

- I. Sex Ed Advisory Board
- II. Conservatory of the Arts Redesign
 - A. Requires students to complete certain number of credits in concentration, participate in showcase and honor society.
 - B. Receive seal on diploma, recognition at graduation.
- III. February Goals Reporting:

By the end of the 2021-22 school year, each school and the district will show growth in reading/ELA achievement and mathematics achievement throughout the global pandemic as measured on the NWEA MAP Growth for grades K-8 and 9-12.
