Superintendent Musary shared the Budget information that had been previously shared at the Budget Hearing prior to the regular meeting.

2022 -2023 Budget Amendment Highlights

- In the General Fund:
 - o Bottom line (Fund Equity) increased by \$35,000 from March 21, 2023 budget amendment.
 - Revenues and expenditures both up over \$1,500,000 primarily due to \$1.2 million MPSERS One Time Deposit.
- In the Food Service Fund:
 - Amended based on actual revenue and expenditures.
 - o No change to the bottom line (Fund Equity), which is still \$56,000.

2023-2024 Budget Highlights

- In the General Fund:
 - State budget not approved at this time, so using Governor Whitmer's proposal of a \$458 per pupil funding increase for 23/24.
 - o Budget model keeps enrollment flat at 1,736
 - o Utilizing ESSER funding of \$800,000
- In the Food Service Fund:
 - o Budget model assumes the state will be paying for breakfast and lunches
