Athletic Excellence awards were presented to the girls and boys bowling teams, three members of the wrestling team, and the members of the competitive cheer team. They have had an outstanding season.

Armada Middle School Presentation:

Before the presentation, Board Members were treated to a coffee from the Tiger Café, led by Ms. Nicole Ewert. The Café is a student run coffee cart which serves up Friday morning "coffee with a smile!" Armada Middle School Principal, Todd Schafer, provided a presentation which covered information about the school. Some of the topics were: curriculum and initiatives, student clubs and activities, points of pride and future goals. Matt Gillett, Middle School Assistant Principal and District Technical Coordinator, provided information on technology and counseling. The Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) program was explained by Nicole Ewert, Middle School resource teacher.

Superintendent's Report:

2023/24 General Fund Budget Amendment Highlights

- Total expenditures are \$553,000 higher than the June 20, 2023 budget due to additional staffing, increased benefit cost, and additional grant funding.
- Revenues are up \$467,000 vs. the June 20, 2023 budget due to additional local & federal grant funding and additional state aid categorical funding. The student count is down 34 FTE from the June 23' budget State Aid Membership is currently 1,702.
- The budgeted Fund Equity is down \$86,000 vs. June 20, 2023, but the actual Fund Equity could still increase.
- Potential favorable future budget concepts:
- District historically does not spend entire budget this means the district fund equity will likely remain stable as of June 30, 2024.
- State revenues are stable so no funding reductions expected.
- Governor Whitmer has proposed a \$241 per pupil funding increase for 24/25 (+2.5%).

Armada School Updates

- At Krause Elementary, they had kindergarten round up this month and the current enrollments stands at 13 Readiness and 113 Kindergarten including 39 (31%) school of choice students.
- At the M.S., the Middle School Band earned a Division 1 rating from all judges at the MSBOA District XVI Band and Orchestra Festival for the first time in 10 years!
- At the H.S., the Band & Orchestra will be performing over spring break on March 23rd at Disney Springs on the campus of Walt Disney World.
- At MA2S, the Fighting Pi had their first competitions at Kettering University (March 7-9) and were event finalists. The Fighting Pi were ranked 5th out of 40 teams after the qualification rounds. Also, Ava Lentz won the very prestigious Dean's List Award and will compete at the State level for this award in the coming weeks.
