Superintendent Musary shared the following Armada School Updates:

- At Krause elementary, March is reading month with the theme being "Camp Read A Lot".
 Students are enjoying extra reading fun with guest readers and teacher swaps all month.
- The Middle School Student Council held a student "Pajama Day" and raised over \$400 for the March of Dimes. The Middle School band and orchestra performed at the MSBOA District Band & Orchestra and both earned a Division 2 rating. The Middle School orchestra earned a Division 1 rating in sight reading.
- Armada High School was rated the #1 high school in Macomb County for the second consecutive
 year by the MDE school accountability index. Armada High School received an AP Computer
 Diversity Award for females in the program. Also, an Armada High School student scored in the
 top 2.5% on the PSAT/NMSQT exam among all Hispanic and Latino test takers in our region and
 will be invited to participate in the National Hispanic Recognition Program. In addition, the
 Armada High School play was successful and raised \$1,550 for the Holocaust Museum the

theatre department has raised \$11,529 the last three years since it started our "minute to give it" initiative.
