## Superintendent's Report

- At the Elementary, a speaker came in to talk to K-3 students about problem solving, empathy, friendship, and teaching kids the difference between tattling and reporting. Also, our dedicated teachers have agreed to stay late once a month to review Michigan's Literacy Essentials with MISD Language Arts consultant Dr. Lisa Rivard. At these meetings our staff will review recent research findings on most effective teaching strategies for literacy instruction for Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade students. These literacy essential meetings are part of school's improvement planning process.
- The M.S. will be inducting 22 new students into the National Junior Honor Society on Thursday, October 25th. Also, MS sports is wrapping up their fall season football, girls basketball, and co-ed cross country.
- The H.S. had several students participate in the Michigan Math Prize competition. Also, students raised several hundred dollars this month to help fight cancer with the Dig Pink volleyball game and the rivals against cancer football game.
- Ticket sales are going very well for the H.S. play (The Little Mermaid) which has four shows from November 9 – 11, 2018 and features 73 students in the cast – 25 elementary, 26 M.S., and 22 H.S.
- At MA2S, Mr. Roys' class has ten new laptops up and running. Also, Mrs. Fiddes' class has new technology for the CISCO networking class.
- Due to all of the new Chromebooks, we will be adding additional wireless capabilities at five H.S. classrooms.

### **Curriculum Update:**

• Phil Jankowski, Assistant Superintendent of Instruction and Curriculum, gave a detailed presentation of the Marshall Plan. The Marshall Plan will invest an additional \$100 million over five years to revolutionize our talent and education system. Michigan has more than 811,000 career openings through 2024. The Marshall Plan will help fill those openings by such things as providing the development of new career and technical courses, highlighting career opportunities, providing scholarships, upgrading career centers, and encouraging teachers to mentor others. Armada has completed the Concept Summary phase and is currently finishing the Talent Agreement phase. The grant application will take place in mid-November and the final awards will be presented mid-December.
