 Superintendent Musary introduced Students of the Month from Krause Elementary School, Armada Middle School, and Armada High School. They were each introduced and awarded with a certificate.

Superintendent's Report:

- At Krause elementary, Mrs. Defever's 2 grade class spearheaded a service project to support families in Paradise, CA that have been impacted by the wildfires; students created posters, made announcements, worked the Holly Days parade, and collected over 14 boxes of items that were sent to support a community in need. Also, Sophia Lewis, a third grader, once again collected toys and gifts that were donated to Children's Hospital. In addition, Krause had an entertaining assembly with a great message on how to develop conflict resolution strategies; students K-5 were given some helpful suggestions on how to solve problems with words, show empathy, and be helpful to others.
- The M.S. had a food can drive and collected over 3,000 cans that will be donated to local food pantries for families in need during the holidays.
- The H.S. had a motivational speaker (Tom Thelen) that gave bullying prevention tips which was beneficial to our students; the speaker was paid for by a Four County Foundation grant. Also, the H.S. received a \$6,000 grant from the L & L Education Foundation which will be put toward maker spaces. In addition, our #ACCEPTED is on the rise and up to 42% and one of our students was awarded a full scholarship to Northern Michigan University due to a scholarship competition he entered.
- ACE H.S. already has 6 graduates this school year.
- The district will be ordering a new freezer unit to replace the 40-year-old unit at the H.S. to be installed during spring break.
- The M.S. PA system replacement process is still in progress, but we are hoping to have it completed by the end of December.
- Mr. Musary also shared pictures of the latest construction projects: Armada High School Weight Room Expansion, Armada High School Culinary Arts Renovation, Armada High School's Temporary Wall in the Cafeteria, and the Armada High School CTE and Theatre Storage Expansion.

Taylor Chambers, Student Representative - School Update

- Taylor reported that many of the high school students are currently excelling in athletics and academics.
- The students enjoyed the motivational speaker who gave the bullying prevention presentation.
- Many of the students are somewhat disappointed that there was not a snow day before Christmas.

<u>Curriculum Update:</u> Assistant Superintendent of Instruction and Curriculum, Mr. Phil Jankowski, provided an update of the following:

 final grade.

Board Reports: Board Treasurer, Susan Nieman, was happy to announce that the Armada Education Foundation recently awarded 27 grants totaling \$25000.00.

Old Business: Mr. Musary provided an update on the wind turbine. The wind turbine is a residential unit and probably saves the district around \$50 - \$100.00 per year in electric costs when it is working. It was a project mainly for educational purposes rather than a cost saver. It is believed that the conduit that runs to the middle school has accumulated a lot of water over the years and has short circuited the wiring system. If this is the case, the repairs may cost thousands of dollars. The board members came to a consensus that it would not be beneficial to spend thousands to repair it.

<u>New Business</u>: Member Cheryl Murray suggested that we might greet our students of the month at the door to get their names and make the certificate process run more smoothly.
