• Kami Keding, Athletic Booster's President, spoke on behalf of the boosters. She wanted the board to know that they were working on raising money for the new soccer/football scoreboard and it looks like they have some interested parties.

### **Communications:**

• There were no communications made.

### Presentations:

- 1.) Superintendent Musary recognized Students of the Month from Krause Elementary School and Armada High School. They were each introduced and awarded with a Certificate.
- 2.) Don Holston, Director of Athletics/MA2S/ACE, provided a detailed Update covering the following areas:
  - ❖ ACE Armada Continuing Education is led by Cynthia Mizuki. It is a form of blended, online, self paced learning in a classroom setting. It is offered to students who want to recover credits and ultimately graduate. The graduation success rate is good. Fifteen students have already graduated this year. Five of those students were fifth year seniors. A student also spoke about his positive experience with ACE.
  - Macomb Academy of Arts and Sciences Academy (MA2S) This is Mr. Holston's second year as director. The Academy houses the AP math and science courses. It offers the STEM program for current 9th graders which helps them get started with a college plan. When completed, they will receive the STEM designation on their transcript. Robotics is part of MA2S and the team is doing very well in competition. The highlights at MA2S are:
    - AP computer science won a diversity award.
    - MA2S statistics class takes 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in Michigan Statistics Poster Contest for grades 7-9.
    - o Mr. Woznicki's AP class competed in the Michigan Math Prize competition.
    - More students passed the AP calculus test and earned college credit last year than we had enrolled in the entire class three years ago.
    - o Robotics won the Gibraltar district event, won the entrepreneurship award, and won the Dean's list award.
    - Robotics won the Troy District Event Chairman's Award and finished 9th in the State competition out of 160 teams and will compete at the World Championships Competition at Cobo Hall.
  - Athletics Participation is solid in Armada athletics. Some of the highlights are:
    - State qualifiers in boys cross country as well as individual students for cross country, wrestling, and bowling.
    - Armada had three college signings.
    - Mr. Dave Fredette has retired after 53 years as tennis coach and was recently named
       Coach of the Year.
    - The athletic renovations are going well. Donations look promising for the proposed soccer/football scoreboard.
    - The weight room and locker rooms have been gutted and are underway.
    - o The new baseball field should be ready for Districts in late May.

### **Superintendent's Report**

Superintendent Musary shared the following Armada School Updates:

- At Krause elementary, second through fifth graders were treated to a presentation from Michigan's
  Attorney General's Office on cyber safety students were reminded about how to keep safe, keep
  personal information private, and keep talking to adults about what they are doing online. Fourth
  grade students learned about economics and careers from six different entrepreneurs over a two day
  period students took notes and asked several questions to each presenter.
- M-STEP testing is underway at the Middle School. Six A.M.S. students were selected among 43 middle schools to participate in the MSBOA District 16 Honors Band and performed on March 26th at Lakeview H.S.
- The Armada Music program was selected by the NAMM Foundation as one of the Best Communities for Music Education for a second year in a row 623 school districts in the U.S. and only 13 school districts in Michigan received this honor in 2019.
- At MA2S, the Fighting Pi reached the semifinals in their division at the State Championships at SVSU and won a Regional Chairman's Award and a Dean's List Finalist Award. The Fighting Pi have earned four banners this season which is the most in school history. The Fighting Pi head to Detroit April 24 27 for the World Championships at Cobo Hall.
- Legislation continues to move slowly in Lansing to allow additional snow days, so there is still nothing
  official yet and we have been informed a decision may not be made until mid-May. At this time we
  have to make up one day which will most likely be at the end of the school year moving the last
  school day to Friday, June 14th. We will be providing the community with a status update on our
  website and Facebook pages.
