Superintendent's Report:

Learning Platform for 2021/2022

- Kindergarten through 2nd grade will utilize Seesaw.
- Grades 3 through 12 will utilize Empower Learning (status quo).
- 5 10 teachers will pilot the full Empower Learning system, including the gradebook.
- 5 10 teachers will pilot the Schoology learning management system.
- Google Classroom will not be an option (we are down to two learning platform options).
- The pilot teachers will also be on the PLC committee.
- The PLC committee will assess both Empower and Schoology and make a recommendation on which system to use starting with the 2022/23 school year.

Teaching and Learning Plan 2021/2022

- The district will return to 100% face-to-face learning in the fall of 2021.
- The elementary schedule did not change during the 2020/21 school year and will remain the same.
- The MS and HS will continue with the same two-week A/B block schedule as used during the 2020/21 school year.
- If allowed by the MDHHS, the wearing of masks will be optional (which is the current plan). The CDC and state of Michigan have announced that fully vaccinated people don't have to wear face masks indoors or outdoors in most settings and as of July 1st, all mask wearing will be optional. In the governor's previous "Vacc to Normal plan, at 70% of the eligible population being vaccinated (we are at 55% now), the MDHHS epidemic orders, which include the statewide mask mandate, will be rescinded.
- During the school year, explore a virtual learning option for the district.
